

Field Report

On October 14, Brandywine Battlefield Park began a project to provide accessibility to our historic houses through the construction of ADA pathways. This effort has been in development for several years and required careful planning along with an archaeological survey. The first stage involved a civil engineer plotting pathway options based on topography and ADA standards, and our team selected the routes that best fit our tours while avoiding overhanging branches. Archaeologists from West Chester University then carried out a survey, digging test pits at 15-foot intervals, sifting the soil, and recovering pottery sherds, building materials, and animal teeth. We are now in the construction phase, which includes excavation, a compacted stone base, asphalt, and grading. In the spring, tar and chip will be applied to the asphalt with a red stone that resembles a dirt path. While construction continues, certain areas of the Park will be closed. Please check our website and social channels for schedule updates, and thank you for your patience.




American Flag Retirement Ceremony
